

In the news this week

The UK is seeing many different workers taking the decision to strike (action taken against employers by refusing to work for a period of time); rail workers, barristers, call centre staff and postal workers have all exercised their right to strike over low pay or poor working conditions. Disagreements are at their highest point in five years, driven by competition for workers, living cost increases and falling wages. One of the groups striking are postal workers, with around 115,000 Royal Mail employees walking out on strike in a dispute over pay in August and early September.

- > Talk about a time when you felt something was unfair. What did you do about it? Did your action have a good outcome?
- > Can you think of different types of action you could take if you thought awareness needed to be raised about an issue? E.g., taking strike action, protesting, writing letters/posting on social media. Which do you think is most effective and why?

Attendance Matters!

Being in school every day that it is open, is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and their wider development.

Our whole school attendance target is 97%. We need your support to achieve this.

Children with poor attendance may:

- Struggle to keep up with school work. In a busy school day it is difficult for schools to find the extra time to help a child catch up.
- Miss out on the social side of school life. Poor attendance can affect children's ability to make and keep friendships; a vital part of growing up

Half termly attendance letters

We will be keeping you informed of your child's attendance % every half term. Letters will be colour coded according to our Attendance Ladder below. Please speak to a member of staff if you are having difficulties with your child's attendance.

Children with 90% and below will receive a Red attendance letter. You may be invited into school to discuss attendance further. The school may also make a referral to the Education Welfare Officer.

Children with 90 – 95% Attendance will receive an Amber attendance letter.

Children with attendance above 96% may receive a Green attendance letter and will be celebrated in school.

Please speak to a member of staff if you are having difficulties with your child's attendance.
