Thank you to all our families for your support over the past year and my first year as headteacher. I wish you all a very restful summer break.


























Year 5 became CSI investigators for their Science lesson this week; one of the scientists they learned about this half-term had written them a secret note, and they used chromatography to work out which one it was.

Please remember, if you are bringing in medication give it to one of our Welfare team; Tina or Leanne, so they can log it into the system.












