

The Nursery children had lots of fun making mini pizzas. They grated cheese, cut peppers and sprinkled sweetcorn.





























Reception enjoyed Beep Beep! Day. The children created handprints to make a special poster and they took part in activities about the importance of road safety.




Reception had a wonderful time at the library!
