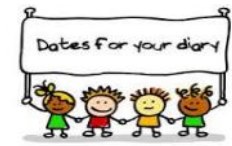

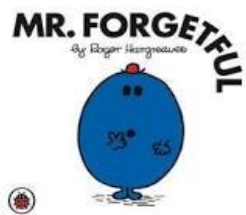
Please send your child in to school ready for the school day. This means drinks, homework, glasses, packed lunches etc., are brought in by your child in the morning.

Year 6 had a visit from TFL this week. They learnt how to keep themselves safe when travelling with TFL and as soon as they turn 11 they can get their own zipcard!

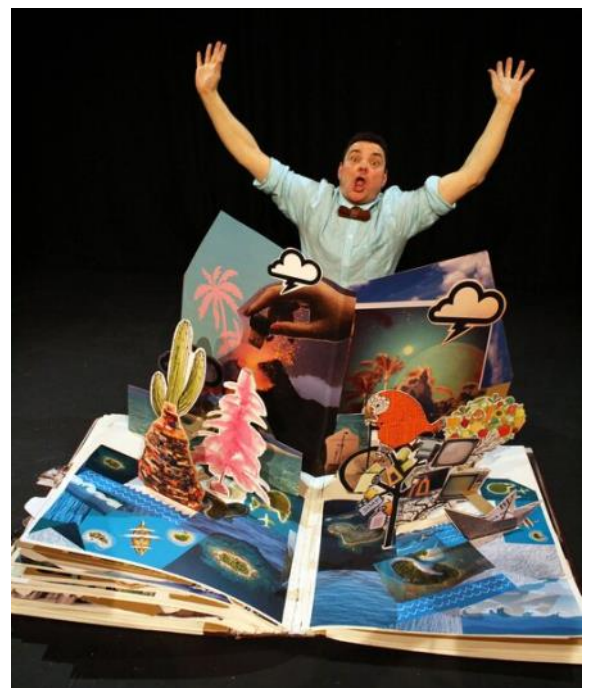
