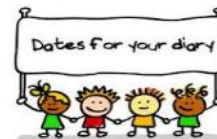

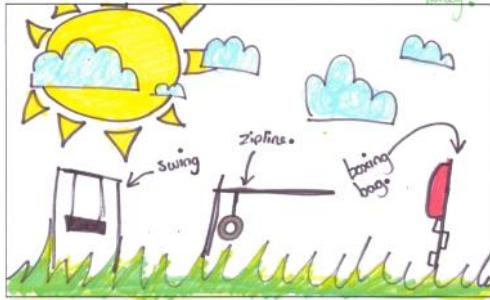

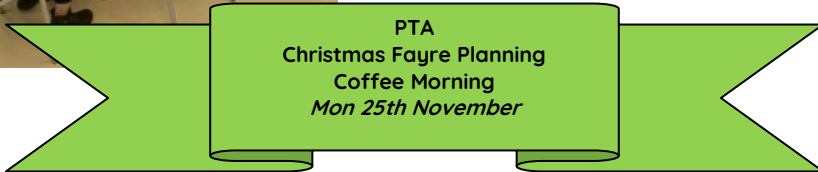

Your child may have come home talking about PANTS and Pantosaurus this week. PANTS is an initiative developed by the NSPCC that teaches children important safety messages e.g. their body belongs to them and they should tell an adult if they are upset or worried.

This week, pupils learned the PANTS message, read 'Pantosaurus and the Power of Pants' story and listened to the Pantosaurus song.

Top 3 tips for preventing tooth decay

1 Reduce the amount and frequency of foods and drinks that contain sugars.



2 Brush teeth twice daily with fluoride toothpaste (1350-1500ppm), last thing at night and at least one other occasion. After brushing, spit don't rinse.



3 Take your child to the dentist when the first tooth erupts, at about 6 months and then on a regular basis.

Parents/carers should brush/supervise tooth brushing until their child is at least 7.

Under 3s should use a smear of toothpaste.

3 to 6 year olds should use a pea sized amount.

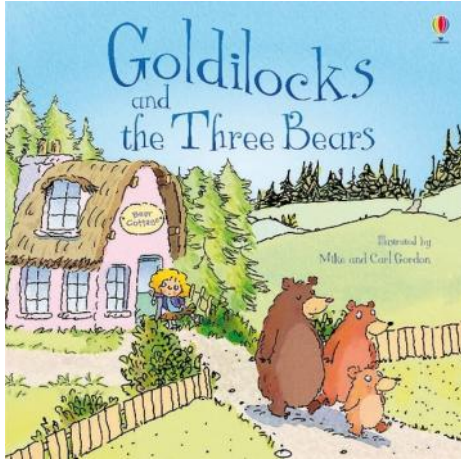
