Celebrating Achievements Outside School

Billy was invested as a Cub Scout this week. This means: Being invested as a Cub Scout is a special welcoming ceremony. It means a new member has settled into the Pack, learned the basic rules, and is ready to officially join the global Scout family.

During the ceremony, the Cub:

Makes their Promise: Recites a personal commitment to do their best and help others.

Receives their Neckerchief: Gets a coloured scarf to represent their specific Scout Group.

Gets their first badges: Earns the purple Membership Award and group name tapes

What happens during the ceremony?

Choosing a Promise: Cubs can pick a promise that aligns with their personal beliefs or faith, such as a version for Christians, Muslims, Hindus, or a humanist/secular version.

The Scout Handshake: The leader typically shakes the Cub's hand using the left hand, a global tradition in Scouting.

Family Involvement: Parents and carers are usually invited to watch their child make their promise and receive their uniform.

We were fortunate enough to have Judo champion, Luke Davies come in to school this week to do whole school athlete workshops . He showed them his gold medal and made them all do push-ups!



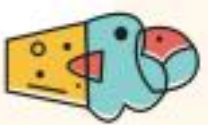

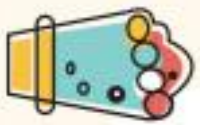

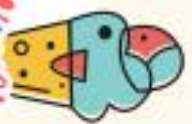
